Classes of work couldn't be performed for in altering the shape of the tunnel under the bay from horseshoe to cylindrical, thereby entailing an extra expenditure of \$25,000 for a machine to bore the shaft the latter shape. Condemnation was passed on the city authorities for loosening in permitting this, and also in allowing the engineer to change the tunnel's lining from brick to concrete.

Approval was expressed of the decision of the city council in permitting the citizens to vote on the question of securing cheap power.

Delegate James McDonald gave assurance that the labor of reconstructing the exhibition buildings would be performed according to the union rate of wages. The mayor had promised this, and had referred them to the contractor who will build the new library for similar assurance regarding the latter job.

J. E. Virtue was elected to the office of vice-president of the council in succession to Delegate R. E. Elliott, resigned. Delegate James Stevenson will succeed Delegate Wilson on the municipal committee.

City Council Rubbed, Too.

The council gave unanimous endorsement to the above views. They also approved a clause in the report questioning the authority of the contractor.

Debt of the City, as authorized and controlled by the said first-mentioned Act, and exclusive of Local Improvement debts and of the debt incurred for Water Works purposes, which, according to the first mentioned Act, is to be counted as part of the General Debt, only amounts to \$12,000,000, of which no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

NO. 816

A BY-LAW

To provide for the extension of the system of Incandescent Lighting in the Town of North Toronto, by the construction of electric poles, wires, transformers and other fixtures and appliances to conduct light and power, and for a Fire Alarm system within the said town.

And to provide for the issue of Debentures to the amount of \$100,000 to meet the cost thereof and incidental thereto.

Whereas the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of North Toronto deem it advisable and in the interests of the said town that the existing system of Incandescent Lighting should be extended and that a system of Incandescent Lighting should be installed and that poles, wires, transformers and other fixtures and appliances to conduct light and power thereon and for the purpose of a Fire Alarm system;

And whereas it is estimated that the sum of \$100,000 will be required for the said purpose, and it is desirable that the said sum should be raised on the credit of the said town;

And whereas, in order thereto it will be necessary to issue Debentures to the amount of \$100,000 for the sum of \$100,000 as hereinafter provided (which is the sum of the said town and is to be created by this By-law), the proceeds of the said Debentures to be applied to the said purpose and no other purposes;

And whereas the total amount required by the Municipal Act, 1905, to be raised annually by special rate for paying said debt and interest is the sum of \$768.76 for twenty years, during the currency of the said Debentures;

And whereas the total amount of the whole rateable property of the said Town of North Toronto, according to the last revised assessment roll thereof, is the sum of \$1,167,347.00;

And whereas the amount of the existing Debenture debt of the said Town of North Toronto is the sum of \$134,337.50, of which no part either of principal or interest is in arrears;

Now, therefore, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of North Toronto enact as follows:

That the existing system of Incandescent Lighting be extended and that a system of Incandescent Lighting be installed within the said town by the construction of electric poles, wires, transformers and other fixtures and appliances for the purpose of a Fire Alarm system;

That it shall be lawful for the Mayor of the said Town of North Toronto, for the purposes aforesaid, to borrow money, not

to exceed in the whole the sum of \$100,000, and to issue Debentures of the said Corporation to the amount of \$100,000, in sums of not less than \$100 each, payable in annual instalments during 20 years after issue and to bear interest secured by coupons attached to the said Debentures at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly; the instalments of principal in each year to be of such amount as that the amounts payable for principal and interest in any one year shall be equal, nearly as may be, to what is payable for principal and interest during each of the other years of the said period; as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed;

That said Debentures be made payable at the Eglinton branch of the Bank of Montreal in the said Town of North Toronto, and shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly;

That it shall be lawful for the said Mayor of the said Town of North Toronto to sign and issue the said Debentures hereby authorized to be issued and to cause the seal of the said Corporation to be attached thereto and to cause the said Debentures and the coupons attached to be signed by the Treasurer of the said Town of North Toronto;

That during twenty years the currency of the Debentures to be issued under the authority of this By-law, in addition to all other rates, shall be raised, levied and collected annually by special rates on all the rateable property of the said Town of North Toronto for the sum of \$768.76 for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt, as shown in Schedule "A" hereto annexed, and shall be payable to and collected by him in the same way as other rates on said town;

That the Debentures to be issued hereunder shall contain a provision in the following words:

"This Debenture or any interest therein shall not, after a certificate of ownership has been endorsed thereon by the Treasurer of the Town of North Toronto, be transferable, except by entry by the Registrar of his deputy, in the Debenture Register Book of the said Corporation of the Town of North Toronto."

This By-law shall take effect on, from and after the date of its passing, and shall be subject to the following provisions:

On Monday, the seventh day of January, 1907, commencing at the hour of 9 o'clock in the forenoon and continuing until 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, by the following Deputy Returning Officers and at the undermentioned places:

Daviesville Ward—At the School House, by Mr. W. W. Whaley.

Eglinton Ward (East)—At the School House, by Mr. William Douglas.

Eglinton Ward (West)—At the School House, by Mr. John M. Whaley.

The Clerk of the said Town of North Toronto shall deliver the said By-law for the purpose of taking said votes and he shall sum up the number of votes given for and against the said By-law on Tuesday, the eighth day of January, 1907, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, at the Town Hall, in the said Town of North Toronto, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

On Friday, the fourth day of January, 1907, the Mayor of the said Town of North Toronto shall attend at the Council Chamber at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to appoint in writing two persons to attend the public buildings and to apply for the Clerk and one person to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in the passing of this By-law, and a like number of opposing the passing of this By-law.
