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## LOOK OUT FOR THESE COINS.

Strait Settlement Half Dollars are in Circulation Here—They are Worth Only a Quarter.

For some time past a great many Straits Settlement half-dollars have been in circulation at Toronto. These coins made their first appearance here about six or eight months ago, and have been gradually fading out of sight.

Many are doubtless curious to know how this money from the distant Straits Settlements came to be in circulation here. The coins are found in the pockets of the sailors and the crew of the ships.

The banks and brokers have of late been a little shy of these coins and now refuse to take them. They, however, continue to go at par among the uninitiated public.

It is understood that this half-dollar is a depreciated coin at Singapore, the capital of the Straits Settlements, where it is minted, and this fact, no doubt, accounts for its free importation into British Columbia.

A like example of depreciated money is found in Mexico. A Dominion Bank official told the World yesterday that he had bought up a quantity of Mexican silver dollars at 68 cents on the dollar, and taking them to New York, he expected to get 75 cents for them, making about 15 per cent on his outlay.

**TAX THEM \$500 A HEAD.** Mongolian Coolies are Taking the Bread From the White Man's Mouth in British Columbia.

Vancouver, B.C., July 30.—A monster petition to the Federal Government, praying for the further restriction of Chinese immigration into Canada, is being circulated. The petition will contain over 10,000 names when it is sent to Ottawa.

The petitioners are of the opinion that Chinese labor is driving out the white workmen, and that the United States should adopt measures to keep them out. They also claim that a tax of \$500 should be levied upon each Chinese man entering the Dominion.
