If the Spanish Government is unequal to the restraint of dynamite atrocities in its principal provincial anchorage—granted what is not yet by any means proved, that there has been such—then it is no government at all, and the United States, as the conservator of social order on this hemisphere, must supply what government it can. That is the only leg of belligerency—and it is a sound enough member—that this country has to stand upon.


