## HAMILTON NEWS

### CLARKE GETS HIS JOB BACK

Was a Good Policeman, But Given to Overmuch Handshaking With His Old Friends.

### DETECTIVE IS DISMISSED.

Can Hamilton Art School Handle the Exhibition Next May? Is the Question—General News.

Hamilton, Dec. 6.—(Special.)—The question of reorganizing the Hamilton Art School was not considered at the meeting of the Police Commissioners this afternoon, as was expected. Chief Smith announced that he had no word from Detective William Reid, who eloped some weeks ago, and a resolution dismissing him from the force was passed. It was decided to pay Reid's salary to Dec. 15 to 725 Reid. Chief Smith said that he did not wish another detective appointed, but recommended that another policeman be added to the force. James Clarke, who resigned from the force some months ago, was re-appointed, he having applied for the position. Clarke, who resides on a farm on the mountain, was a good policeman, and it was stated that his only known fault was his readiness to shake hands and say "How do you do?" to the farmers who come from his township.

The board laid over an application from William McGee, horse trader, for permission to open a livery stable. The Chief was requested to make some further inquiries about him.

An application from the members of the force asking that the age limit of 60 years be abolished was refused.

**Art School Matters.**

It was reported by the Internal Management Committee of the Art School to the directors this afternoon that Dr. May, Provincial Art Superintendent, had asked if the Hamilton school could undertake the Provincial Art Exhibition next May. Before coming to a decision Principal Ireland will ascertain what cost will be involved. The committee reported that the pupils numbered 150, or 14 more than last year, while the fees for the year reported by the Finance Committee amounted to \$500.83, \$64.41 in excess of last year.

At the close of the routine business the principal of the school and the reporters were asked to retire, as the directors desired to discuss a matter, which was the old trouble over the principal and Miss Munter's class.

**Hide Inspection.**

The Board of Examiners of the Board of Trade met this afternoon to prepare a re-

port for presentation to the council on the removal of John B. Brown, that the board ask the Government to establish a systematic method of inspecting the examinations of the candidates for the present system was satisfactory to all concerned. The directors in the board showed, were opposed to any system of compulsory inspection, and the examination will recommend that no change be made.

**Parks Committee.**

The Parks Committee this afternoon heard A. Bruce, Q.C., on behalf of Senator McInnes, who asked that he pay only six months' taxes on Dundurn Park instead of nine months. The committee was opposed to any remission of the taxes, but agreed, as a compromise, to offer the Senator \$100 for the corral in the castle. Mr. Bruce having argued that the corral were not fixtures.

**Sailor Broke His Leg.**

William Jack, a sailor, May-street, fell on Merck-street this evening and broke his leg. He was taken to the General Hospital.

**Iron Men Died.**

Employees of the Hamilton Iron & Steel Company died in a banquet at the Jockey Club Road House this evening. Host Senator provided a good spread.

**Canada Life Assessment.**

Judge Sulder has struck \$35,000 off the Canada Life Insurance Company's assessment of \$107,000. He reserved decision on the same company's appeal against its assessment of \$40,000, and in the appeal of the Hamilton Vitality and the assessment of \$30,000. A reduction of \$5 a foot was made on the Bridgwood property at the corner of Jackson and Hughes-streets.
