

FARMERS SAY DROUGHT IS SERIOUS MATTER

Effect is Far Reaching and Situation Becomes Acute-Runnymede Acts Promptly.

Old time residents of York County, a number of whom have been visiting the Canadian National Exhibition during the week, while expressing their gratification at the splendid all round show, declare that the conditions thruout the country at the present time, due to the long continued drought, are such as to cause grave uneasiness. A dry spell at this particular season of the year is not an unusual event. It comes as naturally as the seasons. But in the heavy lands in York County the farmers state that the drought is particularly severe, and rapidly making its influence feit, in the drying up of small streams, and the shrinking of larger ones to half their normal volume.

Pasture is parched and browned to an unusual extent, while the root crop, at one time promising, threatens to be enormously reduced. The one crop which is apparently withstanding the drought fairly well is the ensilage corn, and the farmer who has a good field of corn (and there are many in the county), is fortunate. In Whitchurch, King, Caughan, and Scarboro Townships, many wells are dried, and the farmers have recourse to the nearest stream to supply their cattle. Some dealers in the city last night from north of Stouffyille averred that the situation was acute, and that unless rain comes in the immediate future suffering will follow.

Alex. Anderson of the Victoria Dairy, McCaul-street, stated last night that the supply of milk has been greatly reduced, but the shortage was not unusual, and the close of the exhibition would relieve the situation.

Up at the observatory the men who wrestle with the weather problem could give little encouragement. It was stated that the last general rain over the province was on Sept. 17 and the long dry snap was regarded as somewhat unusual. Locally, little damage has resulted so far from forest fires.
