THE GILLEN INQUEST

Coroner Barryman decided yesterday afternoon to hold an inquest into the cause of the death of Michael Gillen, killed on Saturday while working on the Royal Bank building. As the body will be taken to Prince Edward Island this morning for burial, the jury was empaneled last night and the body viewed at 46 Union street, the late residence of deceased.

Evidence will be taken on Thursday evening at 8 o'clock, in the Court house. The jurors are: R. H. B. Tennant (foreman), S. T. Gilling, R. T. Worden, C. S. Dunham, Mr. Godsoe, Fred Melick and Robert Clark.

D. Mullin, K. C., who is looking after the legal interests of the relatives of the deceased, was asked regarding the report that an action would be brought for damages against the employers, but declined to say anything beyond that he had been retained.
