REPORT.

This Auxiliary has, under many discouragements, pursued its labourswith unabated zeal, and with much success.

We quote the following passages from the Report of the Auxiliary, which has just been published :----

"The existence of a Ladies' Bible Society, (but which is, in reality, a Society to sustain Bible women for reading the Scriptures in the houses of the people,) in aid of which subscriptions are taken up over the city, will to a considerable degree account for the smallness of the sum raised for the Auxiliary. In the Scriptures being circulated, and, by means of Bible women, read in the houses of our citizens, there is ground for rejoicing, whether the work be accomplished by the one Society or the Few seem to be inspired by the same spirit of liberality towards other. this object which animated the heart of a young woman, whose case deserves to be noticed here. This person, whose residence is in the country about six miles distant, and who is in humble circumstances of life, came to the house of the members of your Committee, and was sending in a small package by the hand of the servant, when he happened to go to the door. On being asked to come in and make some explanation of her object, she reluctantly consented. Her name, she said, was of no consequence, but the package contained a small contribution to the Bible Society, which love to the Saviour moved her to give as a means of assisting to send His Gospel to those who were destitute of it. The parcel on being opened was found to contain eight dollars and a half-a larger amount than is given by the most liberal subscriber in our city.

"We now give a statement of the issues that have been made by the Auxiliary during the eleven months which this report comprehends :----

(2.) The Kingston Auxiliary formed last year embraces ten counties, not formerly connected with this Society. Its progress has been very gratifying, and we hope it will still continue its onward course. The net receipts of this auxiliary for the last year were \$1,543 (including \$300 from the Upper Canada Bible Society in aid of Colportage.) The expenditures were as follows :-
