The Daily Journal of Elizabeth, N. J., gives a brief biographical sketch of Father Francis O'Neill, whose golden jubilee of admission to the priesthood was celebrated last week in Elizabeth, with much fervor and great rejoicing by the congregation of the Catholic church of St. John where he spent his early boyhood and fifteen years of his priesthood at the Cathedral, and now after an absence of thirteen years will school, and after completing the grammar grades advanced to the academy to complete his years of high school. His father, Henry O'Neill, was a merchant. He placed him in St. Dunstan's College, Charlottetown. P. E. I. Here he completed his college course, and later he entered the Grand Seminary of Montreal to study for the priesthood.

On October 80, 18665, he was ordained by his bishop, the Right Rev. John Sweeney, in the old Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, St. John, N. B. One of Father O'Neill's first charges was Fredericton, N. B. He came to New Jersey as assistant at St. Peter's Church, Jersey City. In 1870 the late Bishop Bayley placed him in charge at High Bridge, where he erected a new church, at Hampton Junction; and later he was the pastor in charge at High Bridge, where he erected a new church. Before coming to Elizabeth he also had charge of St. Joseph's Church, Guttenberg, being assigned there by the late Bishop Wigger. He celebrated his silver jubilee in Guttenberg in 1890. In the same year he came to St. Mary's.






