THE BRITISH RESTRICTIONS ON THE LIQUOR TRAFFIC

London, Dec. 1.—The new restrictions on the sale of liquor, now effective, include:— Subject to the usual exemption for residents of the premises and to special provisions for Woolwich, Greenwich, the district about Dartford and certain wharf areas, it is made an offence punishable by a fine of \$500 or imprisonment for six months to sell or supply intoxicating liquors for consumption on the premises except between the following hours: Week days, noon to 2:30 p. m. and 6:30 to 9:30 in the evening.

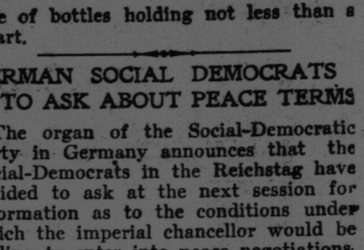
