**ITALIAN CLERICS IN WAR**

60,000 Are Said To Be Taking Part—  
Chaplains, Red Cross Workers and  
Officers

Rome, July 16—According to a Vati-  
can report, there are now about 60,000  
Italian ecclesiastics in the Italian army.  
They are engaged variously as chap-  
lains, as Red Cross workers or as of-  
ficers.

Cardinal Falconio, former apostolic  
delegate in the United States, recently  
visited his ancient Franciscan monas-  
tery of San Antonio, where he found  
more than a dozen fellow monks dressed  
in military uniform, and full of enthu-  
siasm to go to the front.

On a wound being probed at the  
Royal Berkshire Hospital it was found  
that a piece of shrapnel had carried away  
a portion of a soldier's trouser's pocket  
into the flesh, and with it several coins,  
which were successfully extracted.

**THE CANADIANS  
NEVER RETIRE**

Answer of Officerless Company  
When Imperial Officer Tells  
Them to Retreat After Capture  
of Trench

Toronto, July 16—In a letter dated  
June 15 and written on stationery of  
the Grand Hotel, du Louvre at Ter-  
minus Boulevard-sur-Mer, to Jack Her-  
bert, of Toronto, Captain D. W. Megaf-  
lin, 168, Close Avenue, a member of  
the 12th York Rangers, 4th Battalion  
C. E. F., recounts how fifty-four out  
of fifty-seven of his men were wounded  
and how nineteen of these had won the  
"wooden cross."

He tells, too, of a company of York  
Rangers who, without officers or non-  
commissioned officers, advanced, took a  
German trench and held it until British  
officers' orders to retire "because they  
were Canadians."

"I was in hospital for  
a long time. I am better and back again  
in this inferno. It is awful. I lost  
fifty-four men out of fifty-seven, and  
nineteen of the fifty-four have a wooden  
cross over them. We lost twenty-four  
officers in four hours."

"My battalion paraded 181 strong af-  
ter the battle of Ypres. They were at  
once ordered to St. Julien, where the  
12th boys (York Rangers), without of-  
ficers or N. C. O.'s went on and took a  
German trench and held it until re-  
forcements came up and relieved them.  
An imperial officer told me that he had  
ordered them to retire and that they had  
promptly told him to go to blazes as  
they were Canadians and never retired.  
This may sound stupid, but on my hon-  
or it is true. Nothing finer ever took  
place in my life."

"I am as you will notice, a little shaky  
(referring to his winking, which is re-  
sulting from a bullet wound in the eye),  
and of course you know of our casualties. They  
were terrible, but grand."

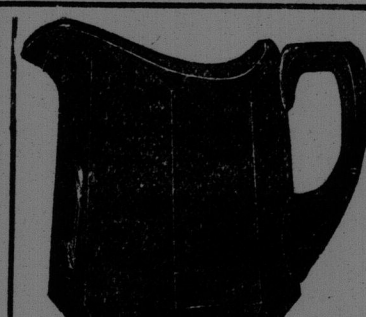
