"The rest of us were tenderfeet compared with the negro, Matt Henson, of New York," said Commander Macmillan. "Henson is probably the best dog driver in the world today. He could talk the Eskhao language like a native. He was the only man in the party who could build a snow house. He made every sledge and every cook stove used on the route to the Pole. Henson was altogether the most efficient man with Peary."

Replying to skeptics who had questioned the authenticity of Peary's discovery, Captain Macmillan said Peary's veracity had been repeatedly proved.


