

## RUSS ROYAL JEWELS TAKEN FROM TOMBS

Some Placed in Museums, While Others Sold By Soviet to Foreigners

LENINGRAD, Russia, Jan. 22.—Several tombs of former Emperors and Empresses of Russia in the famous Cathedral of St. Peter and St. Paul, have been opened by the Soviet authorities and the crowns, jewels and other objects, deposited therein, removed to the local museums. The Bolsheviks feel that no useful purpose is served in keeping these relics hidden in graves and believe that the public is entitled to see the jewels used in royal burials.


