

## BRITISH GOLFERS ROUT U. S. FORCES

Mitchell and Duncan Hang

WENTWORTH, Eng., June 4.—Sweeping through five 36-hole four-omes at the Wentworth Country Club today, Great Britain's professional golfers put utterly to rout invading forces from the United States and won very much.

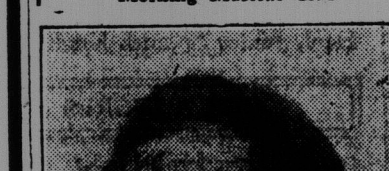

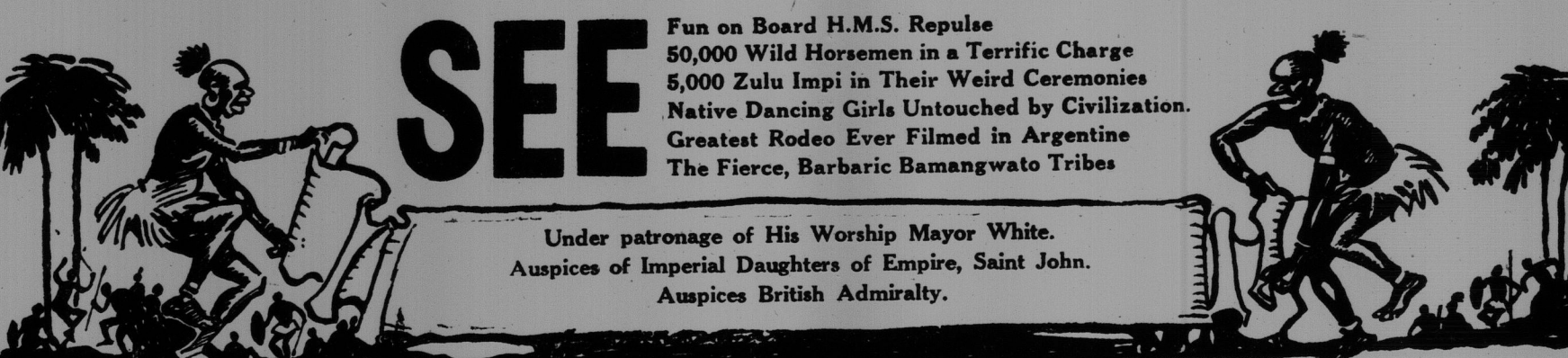
