

In edgree of moisture in modern buildings, is also the subject of painstaking study. Tests are made with a wet and dry thermometer. It has been found that in rooms which have been crowded with large audiences the air is often dryer than that of the desert. The range of these tests varies widely, some rooms having but 10 per cent. of moisture and others 60 per cent. It is still fondly imagined by some that a pan of water placed on a stove or radiator will add sufficient water to the atmosphere of a room. An office building may require several barrels of moister in its air every day.

The exact quantity of air entering a room or building is scientifically measured by a fan deliberately balanced, whose revolutions are indicated on a dial. The speed of the fan is read, and the amount of air calculated with reference of the site of the sit the amount of air calculated with reference to its speed is the size of the intake through which the air is admitted. Those working in rooms scientifically lighted and ventilated are found to work with much increased efficiency.


