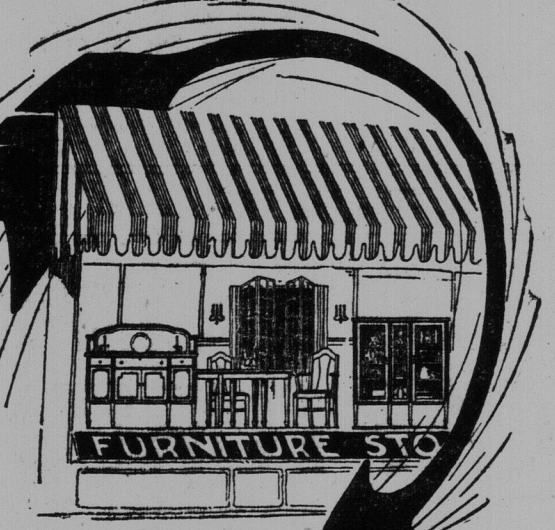

### THE OUTLOOK FOR TRADE IN RUSSIA

#### When War Ends

Siberia Depleted of All Necessary Supplies of Manufactured Goods

Ottawa, Sept. 4.—Siberia is depleted of all necessary supplies of manufactured goods, including the important lines of agricultural machinery and implements, says a statement issued by the Canadian Department of Trade and Commerce. Imports from foreign countries have ceased and the situation is becoming serious. Russia will need to import from abroad large quantities of rolling stock, machinery and other equipment to put the railways and other industries of the country on an efficient footing. This question will be of the utmost importance, since owing to the financial position of the country Russia must utilize its natural resources and develop its industries to the fullest extent possible.

These considerations are especially applicable to Siberia in view of the great undeveloped resources of that territory. An excellent opportunity should therefore be presented to other countries not only to supply Siberia with manufactured goods and equipment but also to participate actively in the work of recuperation and development of resources. For the last three years, the Russian world has been a scene of chaos and anarchy, and the country that is able to provide a large proportion of the capital and expertise required should have a great advantage in the competition for trade.
