### NEW C. P. R. STEAMER NEARS END OF LONG RUN

The new C. P. R. steamer, the Princess Sophia, which has been constructed for the Pacific Coast service, will this month complete her 15,000 miles trip round Cape Horn and after her arrival the company will lose no time in placing her on the run to Prince Rupert and Queen Charlotte Island ports. The vessel is a single screw steamer 247 feet in length, forty feet in breadth and eighteen feet in depth, and

equipped with triple expansion engines with a speed of thirteen knots an hour, while on her trial trip, the Princess Sophia made fourteen. Her boilers have been so built that either coal or oil may be used as fuel. The steamer has been fitted with wireless telegraphy in addition to the usual electric lighting and heating apparatus with which every vessel belonging to the C. P. R. is installed. The main deck is largely set apart for freight service, and the passenger accommodation has been arranged on the upper deck. In addition to the staterooms placed on these decks for the accommodation of first-class passengers there is on the upper deck a large social hall, fitted in mahogany. On the promenade deck there is an observation room forward, with large smoking room aft, the latter part being finished in turned oak while on the bridge deck there are the pilot house, chart room and captain's room. Accommodation is also provided for about 100 second class passengers.

The Lost Ring, Billy's Innomia, Harpooning Whales, and Two Men and the Law, make up an excellent picture programme for the evening at the Unique. The Lost Ring may be classed as beautiful in plot, construction, detail, scenery and acting, as it certainly is the most beautifully colored film seen in St. John. Billy's Innomia deals with the adventures of a young man, Billy Quirk, of the Solar Company, and is replete with many amusing situations, not the least being his eventual rap on the shoulder of his newly wedded wife. Harpooning Whales is an industrial picture and shows the methods of capturing these denizens of the deep, how they get them on shipboard, and other things that go to make the picture interesting as well as instructive. The western picture is out of the ordinary, inasmuch as it has an excellent story, well matched plot, some beautiful scenery and a gripping climax. If all western pictures bore the stamp of Two Men and the Law they would be interesting.

## GRAND LAKE REPORT REVIVED

C. P. R. to Generate Electricity From Coal at the Mines There

It is reported that it is the intention of the C. P. R. which has control of extensive portions of the Grand Lake Coal-fields, to eventually erect plants at the mines to generate electricity from the coal obtained. This system of generating electric current from coal at the pit-head has been strongly endorsed by Edison and other experts. It already has been placed in actual operation in a Nova Scotia colliery, near Chignecto, the coal being converted into electric current at the mines immediately after being brought to the surface. Transmission lines are used to send the power so generated to Amherst, where it is used in the operation of manufacturing plants.

TO PLANT PINE SEEDLINGS

## INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE OF AGRICULTURE REPORT

Bulletin of Agriculture Statistics—April, 1912

The April number of the Bulletin of Agricultural Statistics, published by the International Institute of Agriculture has just been issued.

The figures showing the area sown to winter crops in the Northern Hemisphere are, for the great part, the same as those published in the March Bulletin.

The information as to the condition of the crops is, in general, satisfactory. In several countries the crops are more advanced and looking more healthy than at this time last year; but in the United States and Japan the condition is not quite up to the mark.
