In view of the prevalent belief that the heavy depreciation of exchange must check shipments to our allies, the question became highly interesting, what countries were responsible for the \$119,000,000 increase in our August exports over 1918. Today the government gives that information. Of the total increase in the exports, \$90,200,000 was due to larger shipments to Europee. But the changes in our exports to the separate European countries are curiously divergent. To France we sent \$39,700,000 less last August than in 1918; to Italy, \$7,200,000 less. England is buying more of our raw material; our own trade figures have shown, for instance, that in August we sent to the United Kingdom 140,000 bales more of cotton than the year before—an increase in values of say \$20,-000,000.
