New Orleans, La., May 15.—Mr. John A Morris, speaking for the Louisiana State Lottery Company, today offered the state Legislature, now in session at Baton Rogue, \$1,000,000 a year for the extension of the charter of the company for 25 years—\$25,000,000 for the entire term—the annual bonus to be divided as follows: For the public scheols, \$\$50,000, a year; for the levees \$550,000, for the drainage of New Orleans \$100,000; for the charity hospitals at New Orleans and Shreveport, \$100,000; for the deaf and £dnmb asylum at Baton Rogue, \$\$25,000. To extend the charter of the company, an amendment to the constitution must be passed by two-thirds majority by both branches of the state Legislature, and must then be submitted to the popular vote at the next state election in 1892, and carried by a majority of votes.
