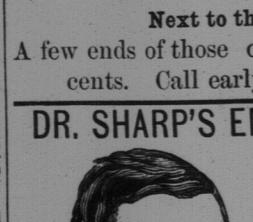

SECOND EDITION. SERIOUS COLLISION. THIRTY LIVES SUPPOSED TO BE LOST.

Two British steamers collide on the Grand Banks and the result is instantly. By TELEGRAPH to the British steamer "German Emperor" from London for Bilboa ran into the British steamer "Berendoff" from Hartlepool for London yesterday morning while the latter was at anchor on the Goodwin sands.

The London survivors who landed at Dover from the lost steamer "German Emperor" gave exaggerated reports concerning the loss of life in the collision. It is now ascertained the loss of life was not so great as first reported. The Berendoff has twelve of the Emperor's crew on board.
