

Little Girl Killed.

Buffalo, N. Y., Oct. 24.—While playing about a railroad crossing here this morning, Katie and Josephine Caselle, six and four years old respectively, were struck by an express train and the former was killed. Both children were badly mangled, but Josephine is still alive at the Fifth hospital. Her father, however, is very precarious and she probably cannot survive her injuries.

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
