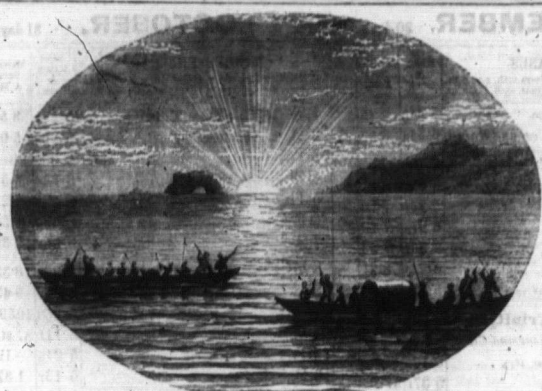

There, like a sea of quick-
silver, lay, far beneath the
grand expanse of water—a
boundless sea-horizon on
the south and north-west—
glittering in the rising sun.
As I looked down from the
steep granite cliff upon
those welcome waters—up
on that vast reservoir which
poured Egypt, and
brought fertility where all
was wilderness—upon that
great source so long hidden
from mankind, that source
of bounty and of blessings
to millions of human beings,
and as one of the greatest
objects in nature, I deter-
mined to honor it with a
great name. As an imper-
ishable memorial of one
loved and mourned by our
gracious Queen, and depre-
cated by every Englishman, I
called this great lake "The
Albert N'Yanza." The Vic-
toria and the Albert lakes
are the two sources of the
