### Further Business of the Annual Meeting.

A vote of thanks was passed to the ladies, and to the friends who have contributed to the Building Fund and to the cost of the Organ, also to S. Greenshields, Esq. and others who have assisted in the musical part of the services.

It was resolved, in order to clear off the floating debt of \$700.00 due by the Building Fund, that \$500.00 be taken from the surplus of ordinary revenue, and that a list be opened for subscriptions to make up the other \$200.00 required ; also, that \$50.00 be given to the Sabbath School, and \$20.00 to the General Assembly's Augmentation Scheme.

The Board of Managers for 1887 were elected. They were instructed to have all statements and reports printed and distributed ; and it was recommended that they give immediate consideration to the matter of a re-arrangement of the sittings.

Notice was given of a motion to change the name of the Church and otherwise revise the constitution—the date of the meeting for that purpose to be fixed by the Board of Managers.
