



CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY S. S. "PRINCESS VICTORIA,"  
ON THE SEATTLE, VICTORIA AND VANCOUVER ROUTE.

VICTORIA is screened from view until the steamer rounding a promontory drops almost suddenly into the spacious harbour, shipping and warehouses, villas along the shore and wooded heights, lofty churches and public buildings, and towering above all the noble pile of the new Parliament Building, the finest in Canada, all come into view with startling suddenness as the steamer glides smoothly into the deep pellucid basin.

The Steamship "Princess Victoria" is the fastest and most comfortable steamship on the Pacific Coast. She was built under special Lloyd's survey, and seaworthy in every respect, with stateroom accommodation for 200 passengers, every thought and care having been exercised in her construction to combine great speed and comfort to passengers. The runs between Seattle and Victoria and Victoria and Vancouver are usually made in four hours, the Steamship "Princess Victoria" maintaining an average speed of 18 knots per hour and making 322 miles in the 24 hours.
