and to avoid tiresome and uninteresting repetition, a general and comprehensive account has been given of the usual methods of procedure.

In the compilation of Part First, the language as well as facts of other authors have been freely used without formal acknowledgment by quotation marks. The author's ambition has been the preparation and presentation of a work that shall prove acceptable to our own people, and a source of reliable information to strangers coming among us; and if these humble efforts shall meet with an approval at all commensurate with the interest that has prompted and directed them, it will prove a source of unfeigned satisfaction.
