28. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Cornwall Canal—Enlargement, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

29. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Fifty thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Galops Canal—Enlargement, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

30. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Five thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Murray Canal—Equipment, for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

31. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and twenty-nine thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for Sault Ste. Marie Canal—Construction and equipment (work actually performed), for the year ending 30th June, 1897.
