VI. And be it enacted, That no action shall be brought As to reprewhereby to charge any person upon or by reason of any sentation or assurance representation or assurance made or given concerning or regarding the relating to the character, conduct, credit, ability, trade or character, credit, sc. of a 5 dealings of any other person, to the intent or purpose that third party. such other person may obtain money, goods or credit thereupon, unless such representation or assurance be made in writing signed by the party to be charged therewith.

VII. And be it enacted, That the seventeenth section Statute of 10 of an Act passed in England, in the twenty-ninth year of Frands extenthe reign of King Charles the Second, intituled, "An Act tracts for sale "for the prevention of Frauds and Perjuries," shall extend delivered at a to all contracts for the sale of goods of the value of ten fature time, pounds sterling and upwards, notwithstanding the goods

15 may be intended to be delivered at some future time, or may not at the time of such contract be actually made, procured or provided, or fit or ready for delivery, or some act may be requisite for the making or completing thereof, or rendering the same fit for delivery.

20 VIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall extend to Act to apply Upper Canada alone, and shall take effect and commence to Upper Canada only; at the expiration of three months from the passing commencethereof.
