
Sir,-

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. Inspector Graham's report, dated 28th ultimo and transmitted by you on the 6th instant, of his inspection of the Touchwood Hills agency, and in connection therewith to inform you that with the exception of the manner in which Mr. Anderson, now at Poor Man's, appears to have discharged his duties at Muscowequan's reserve and seems likely to fill the position where he now is, the conditions seem generally to be very fairly satisfactory.

Further consideration will be given to the question as to what should be done with Mr. Anderson, but in the meantime Mr. Graham might be asked to select and recommend someone to replace Anderson in case of its being determined to send someone to do so.

With regard to the inventories transmitted it may be pointed out that 58 yards of print and 143 flints have not been accounted for.
