

add the area of the reserves yet to be surveyed, 17,017, and the total area for the entire treaty will be 365,225 acres.

The first enumeration, after the treaty was made, showed the Indian population for the whole treaty, to consist of 2,621 souls; and they, under the provisions of the treaty, were entitled to about 335,488 acres.

There is therefore an apparent excess in area allotted to the Indians, of 29,737 acres; but the Surveyor explains that the excess is due to the large areas of water and morass included within the boundaries of the reserves; and that these areas were not surveyed, so as to exclude them from the reserves, in consequence of the large additional cost of such
