
Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th instant. in regard to fallen timber on the Blind River Reserve, and in reply to inform you that Mr. Agent Hagan has reported your application, and in reply to the letter of inquiry sent him, he states that the Indians of Mississauga Band have permits to cut and sell the dead and fallen timber. but he has not intimated whether or not the locality in question is covered by permits.

It is assumed, however, that it is included, as if not, he was instructed to make an immediate examination of the area and submit a full report of the kinds and quantities and values thereon.

As the matter stands, no other disposal of the timber can now be made.
