Sir:-

I beg to say that the Department received the voucher amounting to \$26.25 which you submitted in favour of Mrs. Helen Denny of Eskasoni Chapel for nursing Mrs. Michael Gould while ill with influenza from the 15th January, 1919 to the 4th February, 1919; and in reply I beg to say that the said voucher has been paid at \$21.00. The Department has allowed remuneration at the rate of \$1.00 a day for 21 days.

The account of \$31.50 which you submitted in favour of Christopher Morris for nursing his son Peter Morris for 21 days at \$1.50 a day has been disallowed. In explanation I may say that it is understood that Christopher Morris is in comfortable circumstances, and consequently well able to bear any ordinary expense connected with illness in his family.
