- The President, in closed court (R.F.22, fn 1) reads the Convening Order and the Charge Sheet(s) to the Members, and the Court satisfy themselves that it is properly convened (A.A.49; R.F.105) and constituted (A.A.49; R.F.106, 107), that the accused is (are) amenable to Military Law, and that each charge discloses an offence (R.F.23, 108).
- The accused is (are) brought before the Court and at 1020 hours the trial commences.
- The Prosecuting Officer produces a Medical Certificate under F.P.(Can) 957 (See CMEQ Circular Letter 175) that the accused has (have) this day been examined and is (are) fit to undergo trial by Court martial. The certificate is signed by the President and attached to the proceedings.
