PIRST WITNESS C

Capt Patric Terence Hugh O'Neill having been duly sworn states:-

I am Capt Patric Terrence Hugh O'Neill, 2 Canadian Disc-line Unit (NWE) on 14 Sept 46, I was in Brussels, Belgium as
a result of information received I caused Lieut Mycock, whom
I now identify as the accused, to be arrested at the Hague or
Scheveningen, Helland. I visited Lieut Mycock later that aftermoon after I had returned to the Hague, no statement was
taken at that time. On 16 Sept 46 in company with CSM Sharp, J
I visited Lt Mycock & cautioned him verbally, after which I
wrote down the caution, gave it to Mr Mycock, he read it, then
signed it. Sergeant Major Sharp & I both witnessed the signature, at the conclusion of the statement, I read over the stateement, to Lieut Mycock, he signed it at the bottom of page one,
and at the conclusion of the statement. The statement I now
produce. The statement received, a marked as Exhibit AA.
At a later date, as result of information received, I proceeded
with CSM Sharp and one Pte Shelhorn to Nijmegen, Holland, where
Pte Shelhorn took us to a restaurant, & identified a waiter,
leaving the restaurant, Pte Shelhorn went in a car with the
driver to a certain house in Nijmegen, at the same time EM Sharp
myself & the waiter proceeded on foot to the waiters home, when
we arrived at the waiters home Pte Shelhorn was in front of the
house in a car. We conducted a search of the premises, but
nothing was found.

K46662 Pto Melvin Carrell STONEY of No 1 Canadian Repat Depot, attached to No 2 Canadian Discipline Unit NVE Second Witness having been duly sworn states:-

I am K46682 Pte Melvin Carrell Stoney, of No 1 Canadian Repat Depot attached to No 2 Canadian Discipline Unit (NWZ) on or about the first week in July 46 myself & Pte Shelhorn was in our room, in the billets of 46th General Transport. Mr Mysock came to the hall & called to me. I went into the next room 'this was 5gt Perry's room', & closed the door. Mr Mysock said to me, I have a jackpot full of cigarettes, & asked me if I sould, or would sell them for him. I don't remember what I said to that, but I must have said "yes". I went back to my own room, & asked Pte Shelhorn if he wanted to take the cigarettes out with me & help se to sell them. Pte Shelhorn then went to the Orderly Room to pick up his work ticket, we then went to ake upstairs & counted the cigarettes, there was 59,000 in all. They were in two cases. We then loaded them, "Pte Shelhorn & myself" into tibeack of Pte Shelhorn's truck, then we went to Amsterdam. We picked up a man on Rembrandt square, in Smsterdam, & sold 19,000 cigarettes to him for 4,750 Guilden, we couldn't sell the remaning 40,000 cigarettes, so, we brought them back to Scheveningen, and went to the "Monty's Hotel" where I seem 5gt Perry I gave him the money for the 19,000 sigarettes. I them asked them in my room, and in the morning pick them up, and I will give you a work ticket, as director. The next morning. Fte shelhorn & myself picked up the work ticket and went to the "Monty's Hotel" we then went to 5gt Perry's room. Sgt Perry mont in, so, his wife gave me the cigarettes. We went to "Hambout in, so, his wife gave me the cigarettes. We went to "Hambout a "Hill versum", and we could not sell the gigarettes at either place. We then decided to go to "Nijmegen". We asked
