Even if Lord Rosebery were to remain actually aloof from the official Liberal leaders and from the details of liberal leadership until the tribunal to which he appeals is called upon for its verdict, it does not follow that he could then be set aside. It was the present Duke of Devonshire, then Marquis of Hartington who was the Campbell-Bannerman of those days.
