APRIL.—Now for a few words about hens, eggs and hatching, not forgetting that it is a profitable business if properly attended to. For hatching, reject imperfect eggs, whether small, thin-shelled or out of shape. Twelve or sixteen eggs may be given to a good-sized hen. Mark them with a circular ink line, so that other eggs which may get among them may be removed. Keep them in a warm place, and where they will not be disturbed by other hens or dogs. A hen that does not hatch her eggs should be discarded as incompetent. Eggs that are desired for hatching should be carefully handled. If laid in cold weather, let eggs be gathered by sunset, as their vitality will be destroyed by undue exposure.
