WATER WORKS IMPROVEMENT

Saint John, New Brunswick

Sealed bids or proposals will be received at the office of the Common Clerk until 3 p.m. of WEDNESDAY, APRIL 12TH, 1905, for the construction of proposed Water Works Extension, which will be let in four contracts as follows:

Section 1—10,300 feet 33" woodstave pipe line and accessory structures.

Section 2—7,400 feet 39" reinforced concrete aqueduct.

Section 3—7,500 feet 48" reinforced concrete aqueduct (part in tunnel.)

Section 4—Concrete Masonry Dam on Mispic River (with headworks and gate-house.)

All bids must be made on the blank form of proposal, which with contract and specification will be furnished intending bidders.

Each proposal on each section must be accompanied by a certified cheque for \$2,000, payable to the City of Saint John. A bond of \$15,000 on each of Sections 1, 2 and 3, and a bond of \$10,000 on Section 4, will be required for the faithful performance of the contract.
