Drainage Works

The corporation of the Township of Cavan will receive sealed tenders marked "Tenders for Drainage Works," and addressed to John J. Fair, Millbrook P. O., up to noon of WEDNESDAY, 27TH DAY OF JUNE, 1906, for the construction of Drainage Works a distance of about seven miles through the Townships of Cavan and North Monaghan, according to plans and specifications made by John H. The contractor whose tender is accepted will be required to furnish a bond of \$2,000 satisfactory to the Township Council, and the Contractor will also be required to enter into a special covenant not to unnecessarily interfere with or endanger public traffic on the township highways during the construction of the works.

The Township Council reserves the right to reject any or all tenders or to accept any bid which may appear advantageous to the Township of Cavan.
