 “ the interior quiet and good order of every part of the country where  
 “ your influence may extend ; which is at all times necessary to the ge-  
 “ neral safety, but more particularly so at this very extraordinary and  
 “ important crisis.

“ I do in His MAJESTY’S name Prorogue this General Assembly to  
 “ Monday the Seventeenth day of June next ; and the same is Proro-  
 “ gued accordingly.
