Britain Buys Australia's Wheat PRAISE FOR THE 112TH Output BLUENOSE BATTALION

Washington, Oct. 16—A depatch from Consul-General Skinner at London to the Department of State announces that the British Government has taken the decisive step of safeguarding the supply of wheat for the British army and for the people at home.

The entire Australian crop has been purchased and a Royal Commission appointed to take charge of buying supplies.

The Australian Government has agreed to furnish Government owned steamships for transportation, and the commission has decided to control all shipments, providing requisitioned tonnage for the purpose at fixed rates by the Government authorities.

European counties that are not self-sustaining in bread supplies are encountering more than usual difficulty in obtaining enough wheat this fall for the ordinary home consumption. This is due to the shortage in the Canadian crop and the increasing demand in every direction for the American crop. Despatches to the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce Department state that during July Spain bought 554,000 bushels of wheat from the United States. In that month Spain also bought large quantities of corn from Argentina.
