The clause of the grain commission report dealing with government weights at all country elevators is a reiteration of the statement made by Mr. Motherwell, at the sitting in Regina, when he said that such a scheme would be impracticable for it would be found impossible to get enough honest men to fill the positions.

The farmers all over the west know that there was an almost unanimous demand for government ownership of the terminal elevators, which, without doubt would be a good thing for the grain producers of this country. The finding of the commission is almost evasive on this point, but if anything it is against the proposal, for the commissioners say that if the railways supply sufficient cars there will be no necessity for government ownership of these elevators. The report is uncompromising in opposition to the government building a system of internal storage elevators, and the reasons given for this conclusion are based on deductions published else where in their report. We believe, that to say the least, some of these reasons are unsound; for instance the one dealing with the necessity for having to ship this grain to the head of the lakes at the opening of navigation in the spring. 
