LARGEST FLOWER IN THE WORLD

The rafflesia is a strange plant. It grows in Sumatra and derives its name from Sir Stamford Raffles, Governor of Sumatra at one time, and his friend, Dr. Arnold, a naturalist. They were the first white men to discover the wonderful plant. It is said to be the largest and most magnificent flower in the world. It is composed of five roundish petals, each a foot across and of a brick red color, covered with numerous irregular yellowish white swellings. The petals surround a cup nearly a foot wide, the margin of white being the stamens.

This cup is filled with a fleshy disk, the upper surface of which is everywhere covered with projections like miniature cow's horns. The cup when free from its contents would hold about twelve pints of water. The flower weighs fifteen pounds. It is very thick, the petals being three-quarters of an inch in thickness. With its beauty one is led to expect sweetness, but its odor is that of tainted beef, and Dr. Arnold supposed that even the flies were deceived by the smell and were depositing their eggs in the thick disk, taking it for a piece of carrion.

World's Largest Tortoise.

The Zoological Gardens in London have lately become the home of a tortoise imported from the Island of Mauritius which weighs 500 pounds and measures 4 feet 7 inches from head to tail. It was purchased from a family in Mauritius who vouched for having it in their possession for 150 years. Experts who have examined it think its age nearer 300 than 200 years and it seems to be no more than in its prime.

A tortoise still larger than this one was given to the Natural History Museum by the same person. It weighed 870 pounds when it died, and as it was known to be not much more than eighty years old it is to be supposed that its weight would have continued to increase with advancing years.

Speedy Justice.

An extraordinary story of how Sir Hiram S. Wilkinson, the British Chief Justice at Shanghai, dispensed summary justice is told in The North China Daily News. Sir Hiram was driving out when his carriage upset a ricksha containing a Mr. Frederick Penfold. Mr. Penfold was so outraged at the incident that he leapt into Sir Hiram's carriage and hit the driver on the back of the head. Sir Hiram promptly took Penfold in the carriage and drove straight to the British consulate, where he tried Mr. Penfold in the police court and fined him \$1 and costs. The whole affair from start to finish did not occupy more than five minutes.
