TERRITORIAL GUARANTEES.

The French occupation of German territory eastward to the Rhine is elucidated by Andre Tardieu in L'Illustration. The manner of reaching the agreement on this point of the Peace Treaty, as he discloses it, indicates that Clemenceau brought the representatives of England and the United States to consent to the measure after long opposing it, by convincing them that no other form of guarantee could be devised to render Europe safe against another brusque Teutonic on alaught, such as the enemy, well supplied with veteran troops and loath to carry out treaty agreements, might conceivably make.

Now a delay of the Germans in supplying coal, quite as much as their unreadiness to perform their covenants as to giving up war culprits, has served to arouse misgivings in Paris. Such misgivings might easily load the Millerand Ministry to oppose breaches of the treaty with some form of prudential action.
