# AT WASHINGTON Mafeking's Relief And The

LONDON, May 22 .-- Lord Roberts reports to the War office in a despatch, dated Kroonstad, May 21, as follows:

'Mahon reports that the flying column entered Mafeking at 4 a. m., May 18. He was stubbornly opposed by 1,500 men on May 17th, nine miles from Mafeking. but the Boers were driven from their strong positions after five hours' fighting thanks to the magnificent qualities of his troops. A detachment of Causdian Artillery, by a series of forced marches, reached him in the morning of the fighting and rendered very valuable assistance. Mahon's casualties were about thirty. The Boer losses were heavy.'

The announcement that Mafeking had been relieved was the signal for rejoicing and the British Empire as the beat of one pulse responded to the occasion, and Canada reached across the broad expanse of waters and, and as it were, clasped the hand of her mother country in congratulations, whilst they simultaneously extended to Baden-Powell in Mafeking the hearty respect and praise that his recent

LONDON, May 18, 1900. The following is the story of the Boer siege of Mafeking in brief:

Boer forces isolated the town on Oct. 14. Thus the siege lasted 214 days, if it ended on May 15, as reported.

Baden-Powell's fighters numbered at first about 1500 men, all irregulars excent a few officers. He had eight guns, six of them machine. Seven hundred white women and children and 7000 blacks were also hemmed in. The besieging force has varied from 2000 to 5000.
