A new section asked for, but refused, required that all bars or rooms in which liquor is sold, must be on the ground floor, and must have windows fronting on the public streets, and that no screens or other obstructions to a clear and uninterrupted

view from the street be permitted.

The government see no objection to a provision giving the public the right to inspect the official records regarding applicants for licenses, or to a provision that copies of the commissioner's annual reports be available for

A new section asked that not more than one license be granted to any one applicant. The government is willing but sees no objection to the same person holding both a wholesale and a retail license.

Another new section asked that no person other than those authorized be allowed to sell any beverage containing I per cent. or more of absolute alcohol, and that the fine for selling such be \$50 for a first offence, and six months for a second. The government promise careful consideration. but say they are not satisfied that I per cent is a practical limitation.

The government are willing, or at least not unwilling, for a change in the law making the time for opening bars in the morning 7 o'clock instead of 6. Tht government also agree that sub section 3 of section 48 be amended so an inspector failing to carry out the provisions of the section shall be liable to a fine of \$50 for a first offence and dismissal for a second, instead of fines of \$10 and \$20 respectively.

The temperance men sought to have section 55 of the act dropped, but the licensed, but declares if it is shown that the seller did not know that the buyer was not licensed, no fine shall

It was sought to have the penalties for violating the law made more severe. At present three offences are provided for, with fine ranging from \$50 to forfeiture of the license. The temperance people asked that the fine for the first offence be from \$100 to \$200 and costs and for a second eighty day's imprison-ment with hard labor, together with for-feiture of the license. The government consider the penalties severe enough.

A request was made that no licensed person be permitted to employ a minor.
The Government think a provision desirable preventing the employment about licensed tavern premises of persons under eighteen years of age. At present if a licensed dealer is burn ed out the commissioners can grant him permission to occupy temporary quarters elsewhere. The government agree that these temporary quarters should not be within two hundred yards of a church, school house or place of

public amusement. The temperance people asked the repeal of the beer license sections of law, and the government express a willingness for this, admitting that the licensing of these premises has not produced the desired result.
