Soon after twelve o'clock on that day, while the hands were at work at the pumps, a tremendous sea struck the ship and caused her to heel so far to starboard that the landward side of the deck was under water.

The ship shortly after righted, when another sea struck the bowsprit, carried it away, and also the foremast, at the same time sweeping the deck of all that was left, and also washing overboard Mr. Lindsay, the chief officer, and the steward (belonging to Dayport, but whose name the crew could not recollect), and they were unfortunately drowned. The remainder of the crew held on by the rigging, and after a long and perilous struggle, they were enabled to reach the beach, and were rescued by the crew of the ship.

The weather having moderated, the crew cut away the wreck from the ship's side, and made further search for the bodies of the crew. A great quantity of provisions were discovered in the fore-hold, and half a bucket of biscuit; but on the 9th unhappily, a sea rose the water came, and this lost what the men were now craving. On the 10th the poor fellows had become almost insensible, and were unable to do anything for themselves.

A baker's porter in Cork, named George Jennings, earning 9s. a week, has within the past week been declared heir to a property estimated at £3,000,000, together with an estate yielding £50,000 per annum, as the rightful representative of the late Duke of Devonshire, who has been for years in the English Court of Chancery.

The directors of the Bank of Ireland have declared a dividend of six per cent for the half year, free of income tax, leaving £23,000,000 of the profits to be added to the rest fund. This makes twelve and a half per cent. in dividends for the current year.

A small printing-office was dispatched, a few days ago, from Paris for Constantinople. DEATH OF MR. JUSTICE JACKSON.—We regret to have to announce the death of the Hon. Joseph Devanish Jackson, one of the judges of the Irish Court of Common Pleas. For some time he had been suffering from an ailment, and he had retired considerably, and up to a few hours previous to his death was supposed to be in a fair way towards recovery. When Mr. Jackson died he was represented by the Hon. Mr. Justice Keogh, and he was buried in the parish of St. Michael's, Dublin, on the 1st inst. He was appointed a Judge by Sir Robert Peel in 1842.

HANOVERIAN CLAIMS ON THE CROWN JEWELS.—We find the following in a letter from Hanover, of December 19th: "The honors of the King and Royal Family of this country have been much rejoiced by intelligence which has just reached them through the Hanoverian Minister at the Court of St. James, that the long dispute between the King of Hanover and the Queen of England respecting the right to certain jewels of enormous value, in the possession of the Sovereign of England, has been decided in favour of Hanover. Many of your readers are no doubt aware that the jewels which had been seized from the King of Hanover by the Queen of England, were restored to him by the late King of Hanover, and that the remainder had been purchased by George III., out of his private purse, and had been sold by him to the Queen of England, by the late King of Hanover. As the jewels thus claimed are supposed to be worth considerably more than 1,000,000, a single one having cost nearly 200,000, they were not so readily relinquished as they were supposed to be. It is very possible expedient was resorted to in England to baffie the claimant. Ultimately, in the lifetime of the late King, the importance of the Hanoverian claim was so great, that the rights of the two Sovereigns could not be submitted to a Commission composed of three English Judges; but the proceedings of the Commission were so inconclusive, that the Hanoverian claim was not decided without arriving at any decision; and until Lord Clarendon received the seals of the British Foreign-office, all the efforts of the Court of Hanover to obtain a decision were vain. Lord Clarendon, however, seems to have prevailed that such attempts to still inquiry were unworthy of his country, for he consented that a fresh Commission should be issued to three English Judges of the highest eminence, who, after investigation, found the Hanoverian claim to be indisputably just, and reported in its favour."—Globe.

ROMAN CATHOLIC HOLIDAYS.—An extraordinary agitation has arisen in the county of Wexford, which is termed by the natives the "Catholic holidays." The Roman Catholic Bishop, it appears, has issued an order requiring all devout Catholics to abstain from buying and selling on the holidays of the church. If a fair is held on one of the holidays, the number of stalls is to be held on the day following, and if an ordinary market interferes with the ceremonies of his calendar it is to be conducted on the previous day. In obedience to this order, the Catholic shopkeepers, and other inhabitants of Gorey, announce by public advertisement that they will not buy or sell on New Year's Day, when it has always been customary to open their shops, and to do business as usual.
