

The Nova Scotia Historical Society and its offshoot, the Historical Association of Annapolis Royal are making combined efforts to bring about a fitting commemoration of three interesting historic events this year at Annapolis Royal, the ancient capital of the province. In 1904 the tercentenary of the founding of this place, under its former name of "Port Royal," was celebrated with great eclat—probably 10,000 people attending—and a monument to de Monts, the founder, in a commanding position in the grounds of Fort Anne, or and an extending—and a monument memorial of that occasion.
