

Verdict For Plaintify In North Shore Damage Suit

The land suit of the heirs of the late Martin Walsh vs. James Walsh which has been going on for 3 weeks was concluded here Friday evening when the jury returned a rendict of \$600 in favor of the plain tiffs in answer to the five questions which were submitted by Mr. Justice LeBlanc.

The suit was one for damages in volving the boundary line o' property located on the north side of the Northwest Miramichi on which it was claimed the defendant had trespassed in cutting 48,000 logs. The case hinged upon the location of the garden base line. A similar dispute was triell in 1908 before Mr. Justice Barry when the locus of the line dispute was below the present one.

A.F. Hanson of Fredericton who had retraced the garden line was the principal witness for the plaintiffs while technical knowledge for the defendant was given by E.R. Rutledge of Doaktown and G.G. Murdock of St. John. The case occupi ed 3 weeks before Blanc of jury: J.P. Byrne K.C. of Bathurst and P.J Hughes K.C. of Wredericton representing the plaintiffs and A.A. Davidson K.C. Newcastle and H.A Powell K.C. of St. John for the defendant.

The defendant will carry the case to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court.

Three Smallpox Cases At Campbellton

Three more cases of smallpox are reported by Dr. Desmond chairman of the sub-district Board of Health They are in Campbellton and have been traced to one elderly lady who came to that town from the Tobique Road. She transmitted the disease to a young girl and she in turn gave it to the other two who reside in widely separacted parts of the town The disease has been solated and all cases are being treatedb y the officers of the Board. The seven other cases which were reported at Murray Corner near Bayfield are all progressing toward recovery and Dr. Desmond said that they would probably be released from quarantine in a few days.
