36 All petitions for Private Bills must be presented with percement of the season plusive of adjournment.

37 No Private Bill shall be brought into the House, but Office Inspector's Office, Ch'town, 10th April, 1920, truly stating the case at the peril of the suitors for such Bill and such petition must be signed by the said parties.

> 38 A committee shall be appointed at the commencement of every Session consisting of five members of whom three shall be a quorum, to be denominated. The Private Bills Committee to whom shall be referred every comimttee has reported thereo to the House.

39. So soon as the Committee has reported any Bill, such Bill ogether with any amendments that may be suggested by the Committee, shall be printed at the expense of the parties who are suitors for such Bill and printed copies thereof delivered to the members before the second reading if deemed necessary by
