Prisoners of War in Germany.
The following regulations, governing the regulating and despatch of parcels and money to Prisoners of War in Germany are published for the information of the public. The Newfoundland War Contingent Association is appointed by the Central Prisoners of War Committee to handle all matters appertaining to the forwarding of parcels and money to Newfoundland P. of W. in Germany.

The N. W. C. A. forward a regular supply from London to Germany as follows:—
(a) Food. Three parcels per man per fortnight containing such things as tinned beef, tinned salmon, biscuits, milk, sugar, margarine, dripping, baked beans, carbolic soap, chocolate, cigarettes, tobacco, and a few toilet necessities.

(b) Clothing. The following outfit is sent periodically to N. W. C. A. and men in Germany by the Pay and Record Office: 1 great coat, 1 jacket, 1 pair trousers, 1 cap (the foregoing is a special uniform for P. of W.), 1 pair of drawers (woollen), 1 undervest (woollen), 2 towels, 3 handkerchiefs, 1 pair boots.

(c) Money. It is inadvisable to send money, unless P. of W. ask for it. The amount which may be sent is Two Shillings per week for any one man. The Army Council have instructed the Central P. of W. Committee to the effect that they may not accept gifts of foodstuffs or clothing from members of the public, whether for despatch to a particular P. of W. or as a contribution to the general stock of the Association. This instruction has arisen through an arrangement with the German Authorities that all parcels forwarded should be packed and forwarded by the association. Relatives may rest assured that everything possible is being done in London for the comfort and welfare of Prisoners of War in Germany.
