TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

AUSTRALIA NOT BOUND BY ANGLO-RUSSIAN TREATIES.

MELBOURNE, Aug. 13. Replying to a question in the House of Representatives to-day, Premier Bruce said Australia was not bound by the commercial treaties recently entered into by Russia and Great Britain.

EVACUATION OF THE RUHR PRESENTS FURTHER DIFFICULTIES.

LONDON, Aug. 14. After two conferences lasting five hours, the French and German delegates to the International Conference, to-night still were deadlocked on the question of time to be allotted for military evacuation of the Ruhr, and it was decided that Premier Herriot, FRANCES, Chaqcelor Marx, Germany, Premier Theunis, Belgium, and their associates would meet again at 9 o'clock to-morrow morning in another effort to reach an agreement. Louis Loucheur and several other French political leaders are in London in conference with M. Herriot and the German delegates. These men have induced the French Premier to stiffen up his policy, as he seems more adamant in his contention that a year's time must be left for evacuation, than when he returned from Paris on Monday. During to-day's conferences the French and Belgians waived the claim to maintain their Nationals on German Railways. Agreements also were reached on the amnesty question and other minor matters. At the conclusion of the conference this afternoon, M. Herriot said, "we are in the midst of negotiations which are progressing normally and which will be continued to-morrow." The Germans were not so calm in their estimate of negotiations, which Foreign Minister Stresemann regards as being in a critical state.

FLIERS PLANNED TO LEAVE ICELAND THIS MORNING.

REYKJAVIK, Iceland, Aug. 13. Lieut. Lowell Smith and Lieut. Eric Nelson, the United States round-the-world fliers, intend to hop off to-morrow morning at 8 o'clock for Angmagalik, Greenland, if weather conditions are propitious. To-night they were rather bad. The Navy patrol craft Reid and Billingstey left Reykjavik this afternoon to take their stations along the coast over which the airmen will fly towards Greenland. They were followed at 2 o'clock this evening by the United States cruiser Richmond, the flagship of Rear Admiral MacGruder, which will take station 150 miles off the Iceland coast to await the passing of the fliers and then will proceed to Southern Greenland. The plane of Lieut. Nelson which had been on shore for several days for overhauling, was successfully put back in the water at 4 o'clock this afternoon. The machine is said to be in perfect condition for the next hop off.

CAIRN UNVEILED.

ANNAPOLIS ROYAL, N.S., Aug. 13. An eleven-foot-high Cairn, made of stones collected from the shores of Annapolis Basin and erected by the historic Sites and Landmarks Board of Canada to mark the site of the first port of "habitation" of Port Royal, was unveiled at Lower Granville, near here this afternoon with appropriate ceremony, under the auspices of the Annapolis Royal Historical Association.

MOMENTOUS DECISION AWAITED BY CONFERENCE.

LONDON, Aug. 13. The Reparations conference to-day expected to receive the momentous decision of the German, French and Belgian delegates on the Ruhr evacuation problem, a solution of which is necessary before the negotiations for putting the Dawes plan into effect can be favourably concluded. An announcement that the decision would probably be forthcoming to-day was made to the conference heads yesterday by Premier Herriot of France.

THE LONG HOP WILL BE ATTEMPTED BY U. S. FLIERS.

REYKJAVIK, Iceland, Aug. 13. Uncertainty over the plans for the next stage of the American Army world flight has been ended by the arrival at Angmagalik, Greenland, of the supply ship Gertrude Rask, which has been locked in the ice off the coast for several days. The vessel reported weather conditions at Angmagalik perfect and Lieut. Lowell H. Smith and Eric Nelson, with their mechanic, to-day were busy preparing for the flight to Greenland Bay, which conditions permitting, will be attempted to-morrow. The arrival of the Gertrude Rask assures the flight following the scheduled route. During her imprisonment in the ice and the consequent inability of the expedition to assure refueling and provisioning at Angmagalik, various alternatives were considered, including the hazardous one of landing at sea and taking on petrol from the United States ship Raleigh, but these plans are now happily abandoned. The distance to Angmagalik, which is on the eastern coast of Greenland, is roughly five hundred miles, and considerable ice is reported lying in the intervening waters, but the harbor is calm
