The grain, roots, dairy and domestic manufactures, &c., were shown in the Drill Shed, on Thurs-day, which was fitted up tastefully for the occasion. The day was missenbly cold

Potatoes were well re-presented, both as regarded quality and variety, which to our mind was sufficient evidence that the "bug" was not so vo-racious an insect as we were led to be-burn the state of the state built

lieve. Fall wheat, especially that which took the first prize, was an excellent sample, and worthy a place in any show room, while spring wheat held its own. Barley and oats were as good 'as the average, and the peas (large and small) were very superior. Carrots, parsnips and beets were nothing uncommon Cabbage was very poor, and scarcely worth mentioning. In the fruit depart-ment some fine apples were seen, and also some wretchedly poor ones. In fact,

those, unacquainted with our riding, would naturally conclude, from the display made, that so far as fruit was concerned, Wellington Centre was retrograding.

We next turned our attention to the ladies' department, and came on a considerable number of firkins of butter, which we carefully examined, and having done so, came to the same conclusion as did one of the judges, that in this parti-cular line the ladies were behind what they were twelve years ago. Some of the butter would not realize seven cents the butter would not realize seven cents per pound, while more of it would com-mand the highest market price. The fresh butter was nearly all good, and we held its wan. Home-made bread was creditable to the women of Wellington, and the small display of fancy work made up in quality what it lacked in quantity. Strained honey looked clear and nice, and the first prize jar disserved it. A creditably made set of team har-ness; stuffed birds; and the wild cat recently shot on the Owen Sound road, together with a couple of sets of horse shoes, occupied prominent places in the room. There were about a dozen fancy quilts on exhibition, creditable to the makers, and there highly finished sewing machines of Fergus manufacture. Friday morning's sun rose high and clear, and many a heart felt cheerful by its influence.
